KEY QUALIFICATIONS

I am a water supply and sanitation specialist with experience in setting the direction of national scale programmes and direct management of projects and programs in emergency and stable contexts. My experience also includes research and data analysis. In my recent post at Solidarites International, I provided leadership to a program in 3 regions of South Sudan. Acting as a focal point for Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, I developed and maintained strong bonds with the affected population, governments, donors and partners, especially UNICEF, OFDA, OCHA, GIZ and private foundations, with a peculiar focus on nutrition and health sectors. I was in charge of managing around 40 persons, including 4 Expatriates and €4+ million annually.

I was in charge of coordinating 16+ projects implemented by 5 heads of projects. According to the context, the projects were long term or emergency types. I also was in charge of a mobile laboratory for water quality analysis. Assignments included:
